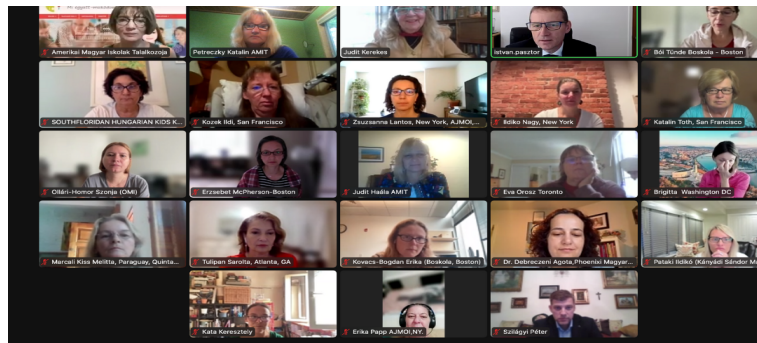

AMIT 2023 Online Conference

True to tradition, the series of programs started with an online meeting of the school leaders before the teacher's developmental conference. Those interested were able to obtain useful information about current events, programs, and application opportunities. In her presentation Andrea Stetz, former principal of the Csíkhágó Hungarian School in Chicago shared her valuable experience with acquiring the ALTA language exam and the Seal of Biliiteracy medal.

On October 15. the 11th AMIT teaching methodology conference was held with the title *What is definitely worth knowing, took place with 70 participants from 10 countries and 13 states of the USA.*

After the greeting of Consul General István Pásztor in New York, Deputy State Secretary Dr. Péter Szilágyi representing the State Secretariat of national Policy, reported on current diaspora programs.

From the presentation of Dr. Rita Pécsi psychologist we learned about the development of emotional intelligence

Kata Keresztély a teacher at the Hungarian School in Paris and creator of the *Playful Hungarian Language program* shared collection of songs, animated films, games and creative ideas developed for teaching Hungarian.

Historian Gabriella Wittlinger, teacher, founder and instructor of *Borderless History* demonstrated through exercises and websites how to build exciting and playful lessons for Hungarian students living in the diaspora.

During the lunch break Eszter Gagnon shared useful information about news, upcoming teaching-related events with the audience.

Dr. Krisztina Fehér gave an interactive lecture on the diversity of bilingualism.

Dr. Hajnalka Merényi and her suitcase of books set participants off on the virtual path to become avid readers of children's literature.

Dr. Zita Máté gave useful methodological tips for teaching groups with heterogeneous language skills.

After the closing remarks from Dr. Judit Kerekes the event ended with the singing of the *Szózat*.
